Eligible children and spouses of Airmen and Guardians can earn their GED at no cost. **AFAS, in partnership with GEDWorks**, offers this self-paced, online program designed to remove barriers and provide comprehensive academic support from start to finish.

Who is Eligible

Spouses and dependent children of U.S. Air Force and U.S. Space Force members in the following categories:

- ★ **Active-duty**
- ★ **Air Force Reserve & Air National Guard members** on Title 10 extended active-duty orders (15+ days)
- ★ **ANG Title 32 Active Guard Reserve** on initial or continuation orders
- ★ **Traditional Guard and Reserve members**
- ★ **Retired Air Force & Space Force members**

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Q1: Is the program online or in person?

The program is completely online, allowing students to learn at their own pace and access support from anywhere.

Q2: How long does it take to complete the GED program?

Completion time varies by student. Some finish in a few months, while others take longer depending on individual needs, schedule, and academic background.

Q3: Is there a time limit to complete the program?

AFAS recommends completing the program within six months of your enrollment date. Students who need additional time should contact the AFAS Education Team at education@afas-hq.org.

Q4: Will I have to purchase any course or study materials?

No. All required study materials, coursework, practice tests, and online resources are included as part of the program at no cost to the student.

Q5: Can students living overseas participate in this program?

Yes. Eligible spouses and dependent children living outside the U.S. may participate. The coursework, tutoring, and academic support are fully online and accessible worldwide. Students will receive assistance with exam logistics as part of the program.

Q6: When can I begin the GED program?

Students whose applications are approved by AFAS will be enrolled at the beginning of every month (Ex: If your application is approved on March 17, you will be enrolled on April 1)

Q7: Are GED exam fees free?

GED exams taken **within the continental United States** are covered at no cost to the student. For students testing **outside the continental U.S.**, exam fees may be required by the local testing center, and exam vouchers will be provided to help offset the cost.

Q8: Where are GED exams taken?

Tests are scheduled at official GED Test Centers or online, depending on your state's requirements. International students may need to take their exam at their closest U.S. military base. Students will work with their GEDWorks
